Hadith 27: Righteousness is Good Character

Hadith 27

al-Nawwas ibn Sam`an (Allah be pleased with him) relates that the Prophet (Allah bless him and give him peace) said:

"Righteousness is good character.
And sin is anything that causes
unease in your breast, and you
dislike people finding out about it."
[Muslim]
